- a. Functions of the Consulate:
 - i. Furthering the development of commercial, economic, cultural, and scientific relations between the sending State and the receiving State

- ii. Helping, assisting, and safeguarding the interests of Mexican nationals, both individuals and corporate bodies
- b. Consular departments:
 - i. General Office
 - 1. Political affairs
 - 2. Legislative and executive liaison
 - ii. Documentation
 - iii. Community Engagement
 - iv. Department of Protection
 - 1. Come to Consulate for assistance with:
 - a. DV victims get T-, U-, or VAWA Visas for DV victims
 - b. Apply for divorce
 - c. Help to get national's records from Mexico
 - d. Financial aid available can sometimes help nationals pay rent, utilities, bill, etc.
 - e. They also interview all of the kids that come across the US border and can talk to other consulates in the US
 - 2. If a person cannot come to the Consulate themselves, a direct next of kin (spouse, children 18 years or older, parent) can come in of call on their behalf.
 - 3. Reach out to Mariá for questions or information about the Department of Protection or to streamline passport or ID process.
 - v. Free legal advice and representation
 - 1. Free legal consults daily at the Consulate, 10am-12noon
 - No appointment necessary, just bring Mexican ID, calendar available at https://www.instagram.com/consulmexphoenix/ (calendar released weekly)
 - a. Mariá can arrange a phone call regarding any legal field if referred by a victim services professional.
 - 3. Can arrange for people in jail or prison to have a free legal meeting. with one of the attorneys over phone or video
 - 4. PALE (Program of free legal advice and representation)
 - a. Immigration, civil, family, criminal, labor
- c. Other help from Consulate includes helping nationals:
 - i. Send money to their loved ones in jail or prison.
 - ii. Understand the US Criminal Justice System.
 - iii. Obtain records, transcripts, and important documents useful for legal procedures.
